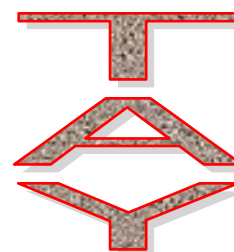

# SAFE MANAGEMENT STAFF TRAINING SERIES

The Safe Management Group training program was developed for staff working in agencies and providing services to adults with developmental disabilities who, on occasion, demonstrate violent behaviours. This curriculum was developed to address the unique needs and challenges posed by individuals with unsafe aggressive/violent behaviour. The training program was designed to integrate behavioural management principles, strategies, and techniques with new and improved state-of-the-art physical intervention techniques.

RSA is licensed to offer this training to agencies throughout the Southern Ontario region. Training can be made available to groups and individual staff within their agency. The cost of the 2-3 day course is \$150 per person. This fee includes registration, required workbook and certification.

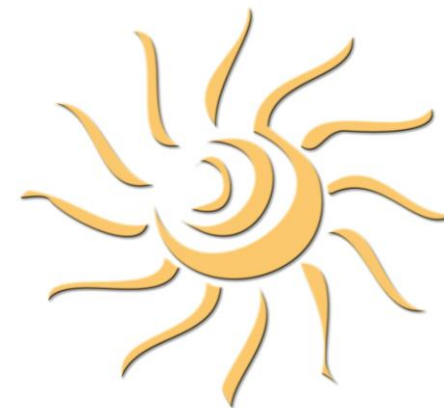

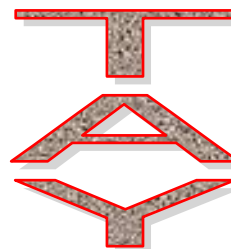

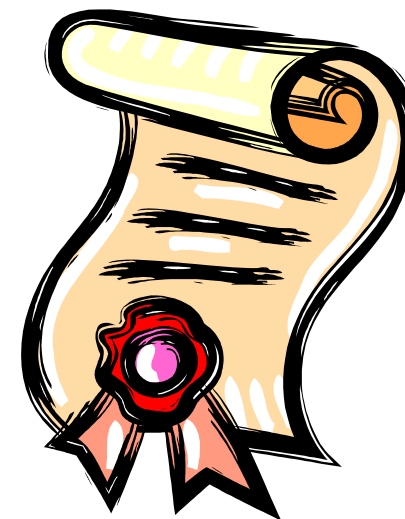

## **ADVANCED APPLIED BEHAVIOUR ANALYSIS COURSE**

### ***Course Overview***

Applied Behaviour Analysis is a vast scientific discipline based upon over 40 years of published research. This course will focus on Positive Behavioural Interventions (e.g. – Feldman, Condillac, Tough, Hunt, Griffiths, 2002) as well as integrate these approaches within a systemic framework (e.g. – King & Carey, 2002) as they apply to persons with Intellectual Impairment, dual diagnosis and severe behaviour disorders. This course will teach participants how to develop interventions that are based upon empirically validated research and best practices for both skill acquisition and behaviour reduction. Participants will learn about: historical roots and underlying theoretical tenants of behaviourism (e.g. – respondent and operant conditioning); performing Functional Assessments; Teaching Skill Enhancement; Behaviour Reduction; Fading and Generalization Approaches; Writing Effective Behaviour Intervention Plans with a Systemic Focus. The course will include assigned readings as well as homework in between classes. There will be a pre-test (online computer administered) prior to the course to evaluate participant's knowledge levels and a post-test to evaluate skill/knowledge acquisition. A Certificate of Completion will be awarded on successful completion of all course requirements.
